REMINDER: PARKING ORDINANCE

This is just a reminder about the parking ordinance since some of the markings have been redone. Remember to park facing the correct direction on the proper side of the street. Per Jeremy McHargue, Burns Harbor Marshal, Indiana Code 9-21-16-5, states that a person may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle within 15 ft from a fire hydrant, 20 ft from a crosswalk, and 30 ft upon the approach to a stop sign. Be aware of what Indiana law says about this here and what the exceptions are: [Indiana Code Title 9. Motor Vehicles § 9-21-16-5 | FindLaw.](#)

BRUSH PICKUP CONTINUES



Tree branches are to be no longer than 6 feet long and no larger than 6 inches in diameter. Please pile your brush so that the cut ends are in the same direction. All materials are to be placed on the Town's right-of-way, close to the edge of the pavement.

In case of inclement weather, brush will be picked up as soon as weather allows.

TUESDAYS, STARTING NOV. 1

FALL LEAF PICKUP RETURNS



Residents should pile leaves in the town right-of-way along the pavement for pick up. Please do not put leaves in ditches and be sure your leaves are clear of sticks, debris, and pet waste. Leaf pick-up will begin on Tuesday, November 1 and will continue every Tuesday through December 6, weather permitting. Note that it may take more than one day per week to collect the leaves.

In the case of inclement weather, the leaves will be picked up as soon as the weather allows.

IT'S ALL ABOUT FIREFIGHTING

Do you believe that you have what it takes to be a Burns Harbor volunteer firefighter?

Requirements include the following:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Have a valid driver's license.
- Obtain all necessary certifications.
- Have no felony convictions.



- Pass a physical agility assessment.
- Pass a full background investigation.
