## REMINDER: PARKING ORDINANCE

This is just a reminder about the parking ordinance since some of the markings have been redone. Remember to park facing the correct direction on the proper side of the street. Per Jeremy McHargue, Burns Harbor Marshal, Indiana Code 9-21-16-5, states that a person may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle within 15 ft from a fire hydrant, 20 ft from a crosswalk, and 30 ft upon the approach to a stop sign. Be aware of what Indiana law says about this here and what the exceptions are: Indiana Code Title 9. Motor Vehicles § 9-21-16-5 FindLaw.

## FALL LEAF PICKUP RETURNS

Residents should pile leaves in town right-of-way along the pavement for pick up. Please do not put leaves in ditches and be sure your leaves are clear of sticks, debris, and pet waste. Leaf pick-up will continue every Monday and may take more than one day per week.
